The Ministers of Christ Are Sent with His Authority to Forgive Sins and Give Life

The prophet Ezekiel was raised up by the Spirit of the Lord and sent to speak an unpopular Word to the rebellious house of Israel. As a prophet, he was not to speak his own word, but to preach the Law and the Gospel: "Thus says the Lord God," whether the people "hear or refuse to hear" (Ezek. 2:4–5). So, too, in the footsteps of the prophets before Him, the Lord Jesus "went about among the villages teaching" (Mark 6:6). In His hometown, as elsewhere, "many who heard him were astonished," marveling at His wisdom and at the "mighty works done by his hands," and yet "they took offense at him" (Mark 6:2–3). The offense culminates in His cross, which is, ironically, the heart and center of His "authority over the unclean spirits" (Mark 6:7). It is by that authority of His cross that those He sends preach repentance, "cast out many demons" and heal the sick (Mark 6:12–13). Thus, the apostle Paul boasts in the cross of Christ and in his own weaknesses, knowing that God's grace is sufficient and that the power of Christ "is made perfect in weakness" (2 Cor. 12:8–9).

Cuban Sliders

These wonderful little rolls are baked until lightly toasted and the cheese melts. The leftover King's Hawaiian ham sliders keep really well in the fridge, and they make a lovely cold snack.

Ingredients

2 packages (12 oz. each) Hawaiian sweet rolls

1-1/4 lb. thinly sliced deli ham

9 slices Swiss cheese (about 6 oz.)

24 dill pickle slices

Topping:

1/2 c. butter, cubed

2 Tbl. Finely chopped onion

2 Tbl. Dijon mustard

Directions

- 1. Preheat oven to 350*
- 2. Without separating rolls, cut each package of rolls in half horizontally.
- 3. Arrange bottom halves in a greased 13x9-in baking pan.
- 4. Layer with ham, cheese, and pickles.
- Replace top halves of rolls.
- 6. Melt butter.
- 7. Stir in onion and mustard.
- 8. drizzle over rolls.
- Bake, covered, 10 minutes.



10. Uncover, bake until golden brown and heated through, 5-10 minutes

Keep Building Up Your Faith by Tim Hetzner from Lutheran Church Charities

And without faith it is impossible to please God, because anyone who comes to him must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who earnestly seek him. — Hebrews 11:6

We usually think of faith in terms of getting answers to our prayers and receiving form God the things that He alone can provide. And that's' okay. But there's a more important reason for building up your faith. Faith is about pleasing God!

Without faith it is impossible to please Him, for he who comes to God must believe that He is, and that He is a rewarder of those who diligently seek Him.

What pleases God? Your faith!

What displeases God? Your lack of faith!

In the past, Christians sometimes described praying passionately as 'storming the gates of heaven'. It was a sincere sentiment, but it wasn't completely accurate. The battle isn't between you and heaven! You have a red-carpet welcome to approach God at any time.

Let us...come boldly to the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy and find grace to help in time of need. — Hebrews 4:16

If there's a battle, it's between you and the forces of hell (see *Ephesians 6:12-18*). Why are our prayers sometimes not effective?

The Bible says,

The word which they heard did not profit them, not being mixed with faith in t hose who heard it. — Hebrews 4:2

Yes, God is moved by your needs, but He responds to your faith. And how do you do that?

Faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the word of God. — Romans 10:17

It works like this: get into God's Word, get God's Word into you, pray, and things will begin to change for the better in your life.
